Dear Mayor Kinley:

As requested, we have conducted traffic signal studies for the intersections of Highway 64/Museum Road and Highway 286/East German Lane in Conway

Our studies included 24-hour turning movement counts, a review of accident history and on-site investigations. Based on the results of our studies, we have determined that traffic volumes at the intersection of Highway 64 at Museum Road are currently sufficient to meet the warrants for signalization as outlined in the <u>Manual on Uniform</u> <u>Traffic Control Devices</u>.

Although the construction and engineering costs related to signalization and roadway improvements at this intersection are eligible for 80% Federal funding, a signal project cannot be scheduled at this time due to the current backlog of signal projects. However, should the City desire to proceed with the installation of a signal at this time, the Department can issue a permit for the signalization at the expense of the City.

If the City should desire to wait until Federal funds become available, please have the City Council pass a Resolution (sample enclosed) and return it to us. The City will be advised when a signal project can be scheduled. The City will be responsible for any additional right-of-way and utility relocation as well as providing power and maintaining the signal after installation.

The traffic volumes at the intersection of Highway 286 and East German Lane are not sufficient to meet the warrants for signalization at this time.

If we can be of further assistance, please advise.
