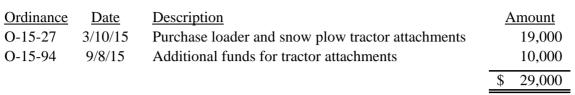

AN ORDINANCE CLOSING THE EASEMENT LOCATED AT LOTS 1 AND 2, LEWIS CROSSING PHASE 1 SUBDIVISION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES:

Whereas, a petition was duly filed with the City of Conway, Arkansas on the 21st of October, 2015 by Tanner Consulting, LLC asking the City Council to vacate and abandon a part of the utility easement recorded in Book 254 at Page 344 and Book 240 at Page 812.

Whereas, after due notice as required by law, the council has, at the time and place mentioned in the notice, heard all persons desiring to be heard on the question and has ascertained that the easement or the portion thereof, hereinbefore described, has heretofore been dedicated to the public use as an easement herein described; has not been actually used by the public generally for a period of at least five (5) years subsequent to the filing of the plat; that all the owners of the property abutting upon the portion of the utility easement to be vacated have filed with the council their written consent to the abandonment; and the public interest and welfare will not be adversely affected by the abandonment of this portion of the utility easement

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONWAY ARKANSAS:

thence north 87°13′47″ west, departing said east line, for a distance of 1084.63 feet to a point on the west line of said Lot 1; thence north 3°04′39″ east, along said west line, for a distance of 15.00 feet; thence south 87°13′47″ east, departing said west line, for a distance of 1084.29 feet to a point on the east line of said Lot 2; thence south 1°36′15″ west, along said east line, for a distance of 8.22 feet; thence south 1°58′13″ west, continuing along said east line, for a distance of 6.79 feet to the point of beginning.

Whereas, the City of Conway has supported numerous actions promoting redevelopment of the Markham Street Neighborhood (part of the NEOCA and Pine Street Neighborhood), which actions include R-13-47 supporting the Jump Start Program for Markham Street, O-13-101 appropriating funds for acquisition of the former Conway Scrap Metals property, O-13-111 appropriating match funds for the \$180,000 Jump Start Grant for re-imagining Markham Street, O-14-107 appropriating match funds for a \$200,000 US EPA Brownfield grant to clean up the former Conway Scrap Metals site, and O-15-28 adopting the Markham Street Neighborhood Specific Plan (MSN-SP); and

Whereas, the City of Conway, as part of the MSN-SP intends to redevelop the former Conway Scrap Metals site to provide public park space and storm water mitigation strategies to reduce flooding downtown, which support for grant funding the necessary designs in partnership with the University of Arkansas Community Design Center (UACDC) was given by City Council through R-15-07, but which grant application to NEA was unsuccessful; and

Whereas, the City of Conway desires to partner with the UACDC in their application to seek funding through the US EPA Urban Waters Grant to facilitate this design process leading to future opportunities for grant funding the Engineering and Construction portion of this project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONWAY, ARKANSAS:

Section 1: That the City of Conway, Arkansas does hereby express its support to the UACDC in their application to the US EPA for an Urban Waters grant to fund the schematic design for the former Conway Scrap Metals property located at 1110 Spencer Street, integrating Low Impact Development Strategies, Park Space, storm water mitigation, and ecologically-based water treatment landscapes with urban land use. In addition, the City of Conway will consider the recommendations brought forth in the design process as is financially feasible and publicly supported. The Project Manager and/or Mayor is hereby given the authority to sign agreements and contracts regarding this grant proposal.

Mr. Mayor, in continuation of the redevelopment of the Conway Scrap Metal Yard, FTN and Associates are currently developing the Cleanup Plan for this site. One of the items that is needed in order to efficiently and cost effectively clean the site, is having final development designs and plans for the sites redevelopment. The Lake Conway-Point Remove Watershed Alliance (LCPRWA) recently brought to our attention a grant opportunity through EPA's Urban Watershed Grant program that they are seeking in partnership with the University of Arkansas Community Design Center. The application is due November 20th, 2015, and due to the short time frame, they are proceeding with the application process, but are requesting support from City Council to allow them to move forward with designs if awarded. The UACDC has an extensive history of being awarded these design grants, and has the ability to pull together an award winning application and final design for this site. Below is a summary from the UACDC on this opportunity:

Title-- Water and Wildness: Reimagining the Town Square

We will prepare a schematic design to redevelop the scrap yard as a town square that features low impact water treatment landscapes integrated with urban functions. Much like a traditional town square, this neighborhood park will be surrounded by mix-uses featuring commercial/retail at the ground floor with housing and/or offices above. The town square will house traditional urban functions like performance and recreational spaces as well as automobile parking at the park's edge. The schematic design will address the town square from building edge to building edge, which will allow us to conceptualize sidewalks, parking, surrounding streets and the square itself as an integrated Low Impact Development treatment landscape. Thus, the town square will become a model of green infrastructure in the heart of the city that delivers ecological services in addition to urban services. We are also very happy that you already have an engineer addressing hydrological modeling and we look forward to working with FTN.

The grant proposal will be for the maximum amount allowed, \$60,000, with \$22,000 allocated to UA indirect costs and \$38,000 to UACDC. Similar to the Creative Corridor in Little Rock, schematic designs (funded by a \$100,000 grant from NEA) were used to leverage a \$1,000,000 grant from EPA/ANRC for engineering and construction costs in the first phase. Art-oriented foundations are also funding a second phase of the CC. For Conway, schematic design will also house cultural and ecological functions to attract investments from various interests.

The following represents the reasons why this opportunity, brought to us from the LCPRWA and the UACDC, is worthy of consideration by council to seek collaboration:

- 1) Since the UACDC will be applying, the only match requirement from the City will be in-kind contributions of time by city staff.
- 2) The Design concepts described above fall within the goals of EPA and the 9-element plan under development for the Lake-Conway Point Remove Watershed. As part of this 9-element plan, the UACDC partnered to design an Urban Watershed Plan for the City of Conway, funded by EPA. This plan is in partnership with the Arkansas Natural Resource Commission (ANRC), which designs were presented to City Staff & the public for comment on the week of October 26th.
- 3) If awarded, the designs from this grant could be used to leverage additional grant funding through the ANRC for EPA Section 319 non-point source grant funding, to fund Engineering and Construction Costs to redevelop the site, similar to what Little Rock did on the Creative Corridor. EPA has been highly involved in this Scrap Yard project, so this too provides an advantage from a federal level of the site receiving future funding to offset the Cities expense for redevelopment.
- 4) The UACDC is known for gaining National Recognition for their Award Winning Designs, which recognition would go far to help promote the City of Conway on a National Scale.

Initial concepts for the Scrap Metal site were developed as part of the Urban Watershed Plan for the City, but moving forward with this grant process, would allow the UACDC to further engage the City in finalizing the design in a way that best meets the needs of the City. The City has indicated to UACDC that although LID strategies are an important element of the final design, attention must first be placed on the amount of storm water retention required to reach sufficient flood mitigation levels for downtown Conway, sought by this project.

If you have any questions, please let me know, otherwise, I have attached a copy of the UACDC LR Creative Corridor Design and its current build out. Mr. Mayor, in continuation of the Jump Start Program for the redevelopment of the Markham Street Neighborhood, and as outlined in the Implementation and Action Plan established through Jump Start, Metroplan has indicated the opportunity to apply for STP Grant funds through Metroplan and the Arkansas Highway and Transportation Department for the Design, Engineering and Construction of roadway improvements along Markham. The total estimated cost for these improvements along Markham total \$3.5 Million, and the cities portion would be 20% (\$700,000) which could be budgeted out over the next two to three years during the design and construction phase. In order to start this process, Metroplan is offering to all Cities who had a Jump Start Project, their services for the submission of an RFQ for Engineering & Design. Due to the nature of the Federal program involved and requirements of the AHTD, stringent guidelines must be followed in the procurement process. In order to prevent errors and delays in procurement, we are requesting authorization to allow Metroplan oversight and responsibility of the RFQ process for the city of Conway. The initial match requirement of 20% for Design & Engineering is estimated at \$107,000, which will have to be appropriated before contracts can be signed with the procured firm, estimated to be around January of next year.

As we move through the design and redevelopment of the Scrap Metal Yard, the improvement of Markham Street will be a vital component to realizing the revitalization of this important corridor to Conway's Downtown. The City Engineer has indicated the ability to budget this initial match of \$107,000 through the Streets Department in 2016, so we are requesting support to move forward with Metroplan in joining the other Jump Start Cities for releasing a RFQ for design & Engineering Services for the redevelopment of Markham Street through Metroplan.

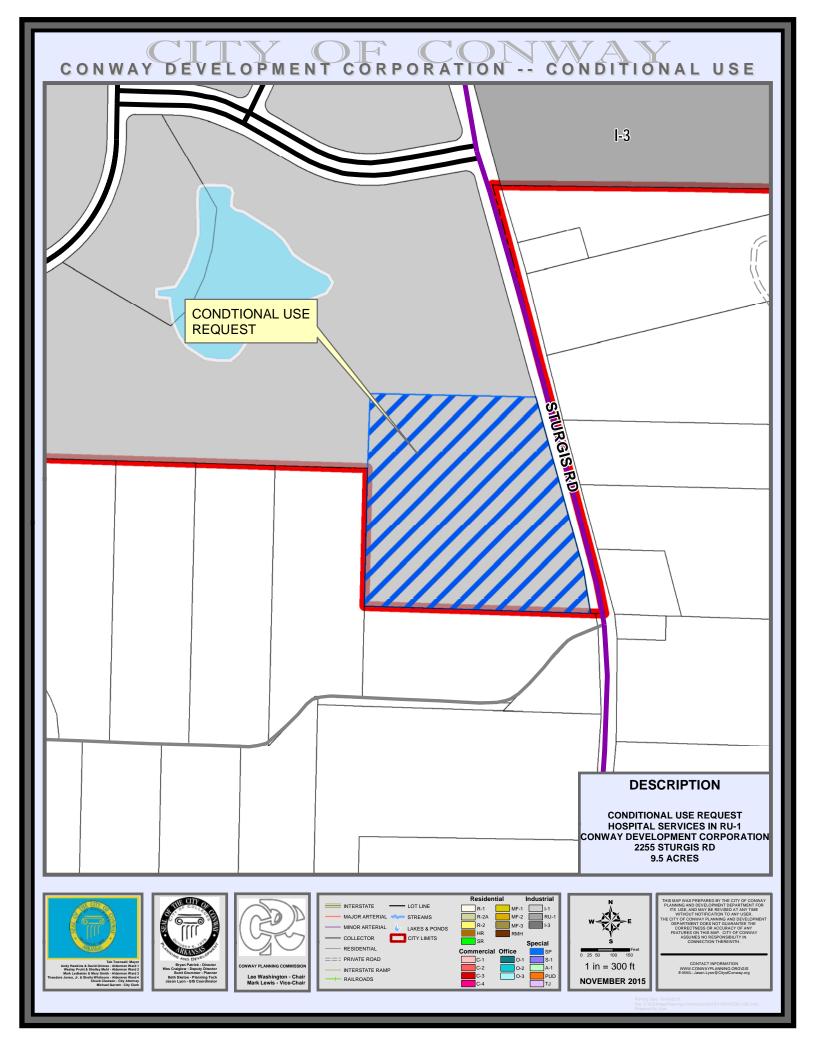
